My family enjoys hosting this field trip each year. We are committed to producing high-quality milk and this begins with taking good care of our cows, feeding them a balanced diet, and keeping them healthy. We had five stations for the students and chaperones to learn how we do this on our farm.

Our Dairy Princess, Mary Catherine Chidester, worked in the milk house telling the kids how their milk goes from cow to table.

Holly Harvatine, a Dairy Ambassador, and my brother Alex taught the kids about raising heifers, the different breeds of cattle and types

of cattle identification. Katelyn Farley, a Dairy Maid as well, helped me in the calf barn to teach them about caring for calves.

My father Rick taught the kids about different types of medicines and how to milk a cow.

In the silo and feed room, my mother Dana and my brother Aiden showed them the different feed ingredients and explained how much a cow eats and drinks each day on our farm.

During lunch we served the kids shaker pudding and cold milk to remind them about getting their "3 Every Day" of dairy. Everyone enjoyed an ice cream sandwich to end the fun day on the farm. Dairy helps you build strong bones and muscles so remember to get your "3 Every Day" servings of dairy!
